As you are all well aware we have a mid-term election coming up on November 6, 2018. Our long-time congressman, Charlie Dent, resigned his seat so most of us have the opportunity to vote for his replacement to the newly formed 7th Congressional District, formerly the 15th Congressional District.

There are 3 candidates running: Susan Wild - Democratic

Marty Nothstein - Republican

Tim Silfies - Libertarian

We will also be voting for governor, lieutenant governor and a senator. More information to follow next month.

This is a good time to check the status of your voter registration, which you can do online by going to: www.votespa.com/status

If you are not registered, you can do that online as well and if you need to vote with an absentee ballot you can learn about that, also online.

There are no excuses to not vote come November!

Here are important dates and websites as well as information on who may vote by absentee ballot:

Last day to register to vote for the November 6th elections is: October 9, 2018

You can download a registration application at: register.votesPA.com

The application will tell you where to mail it in your county.

If you or someone you know will be unable to vote in person on November 6 they can apply for an absentee ballot at: wotes.PA.com/absentee

The deadline to request an absentee ballot is 5 pm on October 30, 2018.

The following are legitimate reasons for voting absentee:

College student

Vacation or work schedule conflicts

Physical disability or an illness

Military

Religious holiday or observance

The final day the absentee ballot can be turned in to the county office is November 2, 2018. It must be received by November 6.

Military serving overseas must submit an absentee ballot by November 5, 2018, and the county office must receive it by November 13.

AAUW Signs Onto Two Amicus Briefs:

Parker v. Reema Consulting Services Inc.

The U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit will consider whether rumors that Evangeline Parker, an employee at Reema Consulting Services Inc. (RCSI), was promoted by "sleeping her way to the top," are actionable under Title VII because they are based on harmful gender stereotypes and contributed to a hostile work environment. AAUW signed on to an amicus brief supporting Parker because the ability to stay and advance within the workforce is essential to obtaining economic security. To achieve economic self-sufficiency for all women, AAUW advocates for equitable access and advancement in employment, a workplace free of harassment, and vigorous enforcement of employment antidiscrimination statutes. Parker's complaint alleges that she was subjected to a false and degrading rumor that she was promoted only because she engaged in sexual activity with a male manager. The rumor quickly spread and permeated the workplace, resulting in harassment, discrimination, retaliation, and ultimately termination. Parker filed a claim citing sexual harassment and retaliation under Title VII with the U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland in May 2017. In January 2018, the district court issued a judgment in favor of RCSI, holding that a rumor of this nature is not based on gender stereotypes and dismissing Parker's retaliation claim as well, despite the fact that a plaintiff need not prove an underlying discrimination claim to prove the separate claim of retaliation. Parker appealed to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit in February 2018. The case is not yet scheduled for oral argument.

State of California et al. v. Health and Human Services et al.

AAUW joined an amicus brief in support of a preliminary injunction preventing the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) from enforcing the "exemption rules" issued jointly by the HHS and the Department of the Treasury and the Department of Labor on October 6, 2017. The rules allow religiously affiliated nonprofits such as hospitals, colleges and universities, and private nonreligious employers to stop providing contraceptive services based on broadly stated religious or moral reasons. AAUW supports this effort because no-cost contraceptive coverage increases women's ability to participate and succeed in the workplace and helps women reach their aspirations in higher education. AAUW has long advocated for the self-determination of one's reproductive health decisions, increased access to quality, affordable health care, and family planning services. We also believe firmly in the separation of church and state. California and other states brought action against the HHS, the Department of Labor, and the Department of the Treasury alleging that two interim final rules exempting certain entities from the Affordable Care Act's mandate to employers to provide contraceptive coverage were invalid under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA). The states moved for a preliminary injunction enjoining enforcement of the rules. In December 2017, the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of

California held that the states were likely to succeed on the merits of their claims and therefore issued a preliminary injunction of the rules. The court found that the secretaries of the agencies violated the APA when they promulgated the interim final rules without notice and comment and that the states would likely suffer irreparable harm in the absence of the preliminary injunction. The court also found that public interest favored granting preliminary injunctive relief. In February 2018, the defendants — the HHS, the Department of the Treasury, and the Department of Labor — filed an appeal in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. The case is not yet scheduled for oral argument.

Amicus Update: Sveen v. Melin

On June 11, the Supreme Court ruled that revocation-on-divorce statutes don't violate the contracts clause of the Constitution. In February 2018, AAUW signed on to an amicus brief in Sveen v. Melin, a case before the Supreme Court that addressed whether revocation-on-divorce statutes violate the contracts clause of the Constitution. The case involves a Minnesota woman who was the named beneficiary on her ex-husband's life insurance policy when he died. The amicus brief asserted that revocation-on-divorce statutes, like the kind in Minnesota, frequently revoke beneficiary designations of women and deprive women of more benefits than men, which negatively affect financially vulnerable divorced women. AAUW joined this brief because revocation-on-divorce statutes, which automatically revoke the prior beneficiary designation of a spouse upon divorce, disproportionately cause damage to women's economic security. The amicus brief was cited in Associate Justice Neil Gorsuch's dissent. While disappointed by this recent decision, AAUW will continue to promote the economic security of women through education, research, and advocacy.


