Voting by Mail

At the risk of sounding like a broken record, here is new information about **Mail-in Ballots** and **Absentee Ballots** for the November 3, 2020 presidential election.

You can apply on-line to get a ballot sent to your home. Go to <u>www.Votes.PA.com</u>. Or you can download the application, print it out and mail it. The deadline to apply for either of those ballots is: 5:00pm on 10/27/20. (The <u>application</u> for either of those ballots must be received at the county office by that time).

Once you receive your Mail-in ballot or Absentee ballot and fill it out it must be returned to the county office by: 8:00pm on 11/03/20 by mail or in person.

Most of us live in Lehigh County so I am enclosing that information. If you live in a different county you can go to Votes.PA.com/county for the address, or call me, I have the list.
